Finding the personal resilience to navigate the "new" normal" in a post-coronavirus world and choosing hope may, in some ways, be harder, but it can be done. Long term recovery and renewal are possible.

We need to make sure something good comes out of all of this. We need to give thanks and focus on life's little moments that bring us all joy. We need to choose hope. American poet and civil rights activist Maya Angelou stated: "We may encounter many defeats, but we must not be defeated."

Eating healthy food, exercising and becoming more at peace with time alone are also important. Watching a favorite movie, finding joy in writing, or reading books that we might never have touched before can bring us comfort.

There is a difference between happiness and joy. Happiness is caused by things that happen to us and situations can damage our happiness. Joy, however, flows through trouble and suffering. Maya Angelou said: "When you wish someone joy, you wish them peace, love, prosperity, happiness...all the good things."

I hope the simple reminders of life's abundant blessings will fill you with joy today and always. Be mindful of the gifts that surround you and that they will inspire you to share your gratitude and joy with others.

It is that very togetherness that will help us weather this global threat. We must help each other in whatever way we can to ensure that we all emerge standing strong when the virus is controlled.

It is important to keep hope alive in our, lives, for hope renews us. Dr. Norman Vincent Peale said, "Change your thoughts and you change your world."

We all feel vulnerable and it is easy to give into despair. of how we react to our circumstances and how we will handle what comes next.

It's not easy. These are sad and scary times and it can be hard to maintain a hopeful disposition.

It can be difficult to pull ourselves out of despair, disappointment and anger. However, hope is a choice that can make all the difference and help us to embrace our future.

Rabbi Morris Adler, who was a nationally known Jewish leader and one of the most revered rabbis in southeast Michigan, stated: "Our prayers are answered not when we are given what we ask for, but when we are challenged to be what we can be."

Perhaps more than any other period in our lifetime, our country really needs the spirit of Thanksgiving and the holiday season.


