

Young Breast Cancer Survivors Share Stories, Offer Words of Wisdom: Part 2

In the last issue, you were introduced to breast cancer survivors Kate Kromer and Sarah Trimmer. Kate, of Bangor, had her first mammogram at 35 and was diagnosed with breast cancer at 37. Sarah Trimmer, of Palmer Township, was only 30 when diagnosed.

"I had no symptoms and never would have known that I even had cancer had it not been for just losing my mom to pancreatic cancer," Sarah said. "It was my mom's oncologist who suggested I get a genetic test to see if I had a breast cancer cell mutation. After learning I was BRCA2 positive, I was going to have a preventive double mastectomy to reduce my risk of developing breast cancer. In order to [do so], I had to have my very first mammogram. That test is what found my cancer."

Because Sarah was already prepared to lose both breasts, she went ahead with the double mastectomy to eliminate the cancer.

"Unfortunately my cancer returned just two and a half years later. For that bout I had chemotherapy and radiation... and had my ovaries removed because my particular cancer was fueled by estrogen.

"I was devastated when my cancer returned a second time. I didn't understand how... when I had already gotten my breasts removed. [However,] the second bout was not a recurrence. It was actually a whole new cancer. Most people don't know that women who have breast cancer have up to a 40 percent chance of recurrence even if they catch it early the first time."

It has been about four years since Sarah's last radiation and she now offers advice to others who have been diagnosed, both women and men alike.

"I won't say not to panic because that is inevitable. I will say they have come a long way with treatments and your best course of action is to effectively manage the side effects. Arm yourself with all the things you'll need to prepare for the treatment side effects. Identify who your support team will be.

"A cancer diagnosis affects every facet of your life, from your job to your home and beyond. People will want to help you and you need to let them. Be specific in what you ask for help with. Many times people will say, 'Let me know if you need anything,' so if you can develop a specific list ahead of time, it's helpful for you and for them. I made an Amazon wish list with specific needs. Ask for frozen meals that can be made when you aren't up to cooking. House-keeping and lawn care were also hard to keep up with during treatments.

"The last thing... is a bit of a bummer, but it needs to be said. Unfortunately, even when treatment is over and there's no evidence of cancer in your body, it is never really over. I still have to get several tests per year. I still think that aches and pains are cancer again. At times the stress and anxiety of thinking my cancer has returned really gets to me. I try my very best to live every day to its fullest and not worry about the things I cannot control, but just because someone is done with treatment does not mean that their cancer is over. It changes you forever.

"That being said, many meaningful and positive changes

come along with it, as well. I no longer smoke cigarettes. I eat a vegetarian diet. Many things have been put into perspective ever since cancer entered my life. I won't say I am grateful that I've had cancer (twice), but I will do my very best not to take a single day for granted because of it."

In addition to making positive changes in her own life, Sarah has also changed the lives of others for the better. She has made care packages for newly diagnosed cancer patients, provided positive messages through #StartAndEndHappy, and even organized a fundraiser for the Cancer Support Community of the Greater Lehigh Valley (CSCGLV), called Beards for Breasts.

After she was diagnosed for the second time, Sarah decided to have a "head-shaving party," during which she would have her head shaved surrounded by family and friends. She asked her friend Stephen Flowers to shave her head at his salon and he agreed, first giving Sarah a mullet, then a mohawk. Before the final shave, Steve asked if anyone would be willing to bid on the opportunity to shave his beard, so Sarah wouldn't be the only one losing hair that night. The event quickly raised more than \$2500 for the CSCGLV, and so Beards for Breasts was born. It is now an annual event held each October. For more information, visit

To hear Sarah's complete story, search "Start and End Happy, Sarah Trimmer" on YouTube. I watched, I cried, and I was inspired by Sarah's message and her reaction to cancer statistics.

About one in eight U.S. women will develop invasive breast cancer in her lifetime and a man's lifetime risk of breast cancer is about one in 1,000 (BreastCancer.org). Although there isn't a cure, there are steps we can take to help prevent cancer, like maintaining a healthy weight, getting regular exercise, and scheduling regular breast cancer screenings with your doctor. If you don't have health insurance, find a center that offers low-cost or free mammograms by contacting the National Cancer Institute at 1-800-4-CANCER, or the American Cancer Society at 1-800-ACS-2345. You can also contact the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program, which provides low-cost or free cancer screenings for women without health insurance, at 1-888-842-6355. It's been three years since the Green Knights beat the Slaters on the football field, but the Knights have been in the overall lead for the past 13, at 50-45-4. Now in its 100th year, this is one rivalry in which stats don't necessarily mean much. There's no telling how this milestone Bangor vs. Pen Argyl football game will end on October 26th.

"A victory any year in this rivalry game is hard-earned and special for players, coaches, and fans," said Bangor Football Coach Paul Reduzzi. "This year's game is obviously on a bigger stage and a victory will be even more important to everyone involved."

In honor of the 100th football game between Bangor and Pen Argyl, let's take a walk down memory lane and hear from rivalry alumni.

-Richard Houck, BAHS Class of '65: "In the last guarter of the game (1964), we were able to break a 7-7 tie and come away with a 14-7 win, ending Pen Argyl's streak of three consecutive wins and returning the Ike Resh trophy to the Bangor trophy case. We ended the season with a 7-2-1 record, the best in many years for a Slater team. In 1963, Pen Argyl beat Bangor pretty convincingly and added an insult by allowing some of their linemen to carry the ball. Then in 1964, even though Bangor was leading 14-7, our coach allowed our center, Glen Grigg, to carry the ball on the last play. Payback was so sweet!"

-Roger Woolley, PAHS Class of '74: "My junior year we were in a 0-0 tie near the end of the game when Rhys Williams intercepted a pass on a fake punt and returned it for a touchdown. We won 6-0."

-Rick Behler, PAHS Class of '77: "My most memorable rivalry game was during my senior year, 1976 at Bangor. Pen Argyl was winning 3-0. There were two minutes left in the game. Pen Argyl snapped the ball and I ran into the opposing end zone, giving a safety to Bangor and two points. Then Pen Argyl kicked the ball to Bangor. Pen Argyl defense held Bangor and we won."

-William "Bill" Buskirk, PAHS Class of '78: "My senior year against Bangor was memorable for a few reasons. The best was that I won the MVP award that night... and getting handed the trophy knowing we just beat [Bangor]. My mom kept a scrapbook of all my football write-ups 'Buskirk Paces Knights 36-6 Over Slaters.' That year during the game, I separated my shoulder but kept playing--at least for some of the time. Yeah, it was memorable because it was painful!"

-William "Bill" Levine, BAHS Class of '83: "In 1981 we were warming up at Bangor Park. When we came back out for the game, there were three inches of snow! It was very cool to play in the snow."

-Dave DeRea, BAHS Class of '89: "The rivalry meant everything. It was huge. When you play Pen Argyl, it doesn't matter what either of your records are at that time. It's just gonna be a real tough game. That game is pretty much a season in itself."

Easy Pumpkin Peanut Butter Dog Treats

Ingredients:

1 cup 100% Pure Pumpkin Puree, canned 1/2 cup Natural Peanut Butter1 3/4 cups whole wheat flour

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper. In a large bowl, stir together pumpkin and peanut butter. Stir in the flour 1/4 cup at a time just until dough forms. Roll the dough out between two sheets of parchment paper to 1/4" thick. Use a cookie cutter to cut out the dough, then place on the prepared pan. Bake at 350 degrees Fahrenheit for 8-10 minutes. Let cool completely. Store in an airtight container or freeze for up to 3 months.
