9/11 National Memorial Trail Ride Touring

Cyclists from across the Country are participating in The 9/11 National Memorial Trail ride touring approximately 1,200 miles over 27 days fundraising for the organization. The riders have been traversing through scenic landscapes paying tribute to the memory of those affected by the events of September 11, 2001. As they ride across the terrain and peddle through some of the hottest days this year, the cyclists are taking breaks with The 9/11 National Memorial Trail partners a long the way.

On June 20, the cyclists visited with WM, a partner of the trail organization since 2021. Approximately, twenty cyclists traded their bikes in for the day to ride an airconditioned bus around the Grand Central Landfill facility learning how landfill gas can create electricity and how closed portions of the landfill become open space and a certified wildlife habitat. Following the bus tour, the group enjoyed a lunch and learn session with bird bander Kevin



Kelly, an employee of Grand Central's working toward his Master Federal Bird Banding License while training under the mentorship of Jere Schade, the landfill's Master Bird Bander. Together, we watched closely as Kevin placed a small bracelet like band around the ankle of the small falcon as he explained the importance of the citizen science project. "The bands are like a social security number. And

if the bird is ever found, the finder can report that band number to the Bird Banding Laboratory and together we all learn the patterns of the birds." Explained Kevin Kelly.

While the cyclists are out rallying their communities to help raise funds for The 9/11 National Memorial Trail, the organization recently received

a generous matching grant of \$10,000 by anonymous donor. The Fourth of July is a great time to celebrate with friends, food and fun in the sun. But not so much fun for your pet. It's important to remember that certain events and activities can be hazardous for animals. Here are a few tips to keep your pet happy and healthy this Fourth of July!

• Loud, crowded fireworks displays are no fun for pets, who can become frightened or disoriented by the loud noise. Please resist the urge to take them to your Fourth of July festivities. Instead, keep them safe from the noise in a quiet, sheltered and escapeproof area at home.

Never use fireworks around pets! While exposure to lit fireworks can potentially result in severe burns and/or trauma to the face and paws of curious pets. Even unused fireworks can pose a danger. Many types contain potentially toxic substances, including potassium nitrate, arsenic and other heavy metals.
Be prepared in the event that your pet does escape. Keep your pets IDs up to date! It's a good idea for all your pets, even indoor-only pets, to always wear a collar with an ID tag that includes your name, phone number and any relevant contact information.

Boscola Announces Two Slate Belt Farms to be Preserved as Part of Commonwealth's Farmland Preservation Program

Senator Lisa Boscola announced today that two additional farms located in the Slate Belt have been preserved as part of Pennsylvania's nation leading Farmland Preservation Program. The two farms are the Kerrs Windy Hill Farm, LLC, located in Washington Twp., which is a 10-acre beef operation and the farm owned by Barbara Rokas, located in Upper Mount Bethel Twp., which is a 42-acre crop operation. Total investment made into preserving these farms is \$181,645 with the state investing \$19,193 and Northampton County investing \$162,452.

"Our Commonwealth and Counties continue to realize the importance of preserving farmland to ensure there is farmland available for future generations by protecting it from future development. That is why I am so pleased to see these Slate Belt farms added to the Farmland Preservation Program," Senator Boscola stated. "Through farmland preservation, we ensure Pennsylvania's farming community remains the backbone of our state's economy and an irreplaceable resource that benefits our environment, crop and livestock industries, rural communities, and grocery shoppers," The announcement means that the Commonwealth's Farmland Preservation Program added an additional 2,629 acres on 28 farms in 19 counties. Since 1988, when voters overwhelmingly supported creation of the Farmland Preservation Program, Pennsylvania has protected 6,392 farms and 639,254 acres in 58 counties from future development, investing more than \$1.7 billion in state, county, and local funds.

Tristan Frisch Eagle Scout Project Community Blood Drive

Tristan Frisch a Life Scout of Troop 102 and resident of Saylorsburg is hosting a Community Blood Drive in memory of his grandmother. During the last 10 years of her life she was very ill and required over 200 units of blood.

That inspired Tristan as he saw first hand how important donating blood is and wanted to help his community and honor his grandmother. His goal is to collect 1,000 pints of blood.
