Four Students From Bangor Area High School To Participate in All-State Honors Chorus

Four Students from Bangor Area High School reached the highest level a high school musician can achieve by earning places in the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) All-State Festival music ensemble. These four were among the 25 Bangor Students who were selected for District 10 Chorus in January. District 10 includes approximately 75 schools. Of these, 14 Bangor students were selected for Region V Chorus along with students from 150 other schools. These numbers are among the highest in Pennsylvania.

Each year, thousands of high school musicians across the state audition in their geographic area. Individually, students perform for a panel of judges. Student musicians who rank the highest advance to compete against student musicians from other parts of PMEA Regions. The highest-ranking student musicians at the PMEA Region level qualify to perform in the Pennsylvania All-State Chorus.

Students selected from Bangor are Lizzy Rutt, Kaylee Holland, CJ Fassl and Evan Finkbeiner. They will also be performing in Les Miserables on April 1-3 at the M Craig Paine Theater in Bangor Area High School.

The annual PMEA All-State Festival is at the Kalahari Resort in The Poconos April 8-9, 2022.



11:30am. Before refrigeration, ice harvesting from frozen lakes and ponds was a very large industry and an important part of rural life. Iceboxes, the precursor to the refrigerator, were common in many households and ice harvested during the winter were used to keep the icebox cold. The commercial ice industry utilized huge icehouses to store the harvested ice for distribution by the iceman to customers. In addition, many farmers constructed small icehouses that were filled with ice for their own use to preserve food. Guest speaker Bill Leonard, Jr. will cover the history of ice harvesting, the tools used, how ice was harvested, and a local ice harvest that continues today.
