





### Ingredients:

1/3 c. sugar

1/3 c. packed brown sugar

3/4 c. all-purpose flour

1/2 tsp. baking powder

1/8 tsp. baking soda

1/8 tsp. salt

1 cup quick-cooking oats

1 cup dried cranberries

1 cup vanilla chips

1/2 cup butter, melted 1 eaa

1 tsp. vanilla extract

### Directions:

In a quart size glass jar, layer the sugar and brown sugar packing well between layers.

Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt and spoon into a mason jar. Top with oats, cranberries and chips. Cover with lid.

To make cookies: Pour cookie mix into a large mixing bowl; stir to combine. Beat in butter, egg and vanilla. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Drop by tablespoonfuls 2 inches apart onto ungreased baking sheets.

Bake at 375°F for 8-10 min. or until browned. Remove to wire racks to cool.
